were the most popular lexicographical genre in Russia during the 16th and 17th centuries. More than 100 manuscripts have come down to us safely, and the bulk of them belong to the so-called “second type” of Azbukovnik. A corpus-based analysis of the manuscripts made it possible to improve previous classifications. This involved distinguishing several redactions among representatives of the second-type Azbukovniks and expanding the Grammatical and Fyodorov groups of copies.

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
